You all know you are allowed to buy essential products, lalalala. And the exempted ones for your reference are only the following:

- 1. Health workers
- 2. Authorized government officials
- 3. Those who are traveling for medical and humanitarian reasons
- 4. Persons providing basic services and public utilities
- 5. Persons delivering foods and medicines and
- 6. Essential skeletal workers of the City Gov't of Makati

I think this list by the Mayor has been superceded by the new announcement of the President. And I think everyone by now knows who can and who cannot.

This is the FAQ that is divisive:

Can I still go outside for essentials, exercise and fresh air?

Yes. People will still be able to leave their homes to handle essential business in limited circumstances – like buying groceries and medicines – and to get fresh air. But when people do need to leave their homes, the government has mandated maintenance of at least 1 M from other individuals and (this one I lifted from San Francisco Chronicles) to wash their hands for at least 20 seconds as often as possible. I leave it to you to rethink if it is 100% safe to go out and inhale the fresh air
